AGENDA 2. WELCOME SPEECH..... Guest of Honor

If there was anything he can do to help during their stay, please let him know. He wished all success to AVC in this meeting and all activities. He also wished all B/A members a nice stay in Bangkok and returned home safe and sound.

AGENDA 3. OPENING AND WELCOME ADDRESS AVC President

Dr. Saleh A. Bin Nasser extended his sincere gratitude to Mr. Somporn Chaibangyang, TVA President for welcoming all of members. AVC President also welcomed all AVC Board of Administration members, AVC Technical Committee Chairmen, and all guests for their attention. After AVC HQ has been moved to Bangkok, AVC received strong support from TVA in every aspect. Attending the BA meeting is a good opportunity to learn and develop volleyball in our confederation. He also appreciated all attendants to make this annual meeting success. Finally, yet importantly, he thanked Mr. Shanrit and AVC HQ staff for hard working in all AVC activities including this meeting. He also thanked Mr. Wei Jizhong for recommendations, as well as Mr. Hamza, Madam Rita, Mr. Shanrit for the great work in AVC activities.

AGENDA 4. APPROVAL OF AGENDA (as attached in Appendix 1).

Decision

The Agenda was acknowledged and approved with no remarks.

AGENDA 5. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE 40TH BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION MEETING IN PATTAYA, CHON BURI, THAILAND ON MAY 11, 2018 (as attached in Appendix 2).

Mr. Graham has requested the Organizing Committee of Commonwealth Games in Birmingham, England in 2022 to include beach volleyball in the program since 2018. The decision to include beach volleyball will be decided on June 18, 2019. Mr. Graham will inform the AVC Board of Administration members about the decision.

Regarding American Samoa, everything has been fixed. The suspension is lifted.

Decision

The minutes was approved with remarks of Mr. Hugh Graham about status of beach volleyball in Commonwealth Games in 2022 and American Samoa.

AGENDA 6. REPORTS

6.1 President's Report

AVC President extended his gratitude to Mr. Wei, all Executive Committee Members, Board of Administration Members, and Chairmen of AVC Technical Committees for their great support and contribution. He reported all the activities in 2018. Last year, AVC had received strong cooperation and support from all members and National Federations in conducting our activities in very high level. He did hope to receive the same strong support for all upcoming activities.

Mr. Shanrit informed that AVC HQ staff gave all members the full version of President's Report and Working files at the end of meeting.

The details as appeared in Appendix 3.

Decision

The report and comments were acknowledged and approved.

6.2 Zonal Activities Reports

6.2.1 Eastern Zone

Mr. Cai Yi reported the Eastern Zone activities. Mr. Cai Yi requested AVC to give financial support to Mongolia and DPR Korea, so that they will be able to participate in Zonal Championship every year.

Mr. Hamza advised that FIVB has stopped financial support to National Federations. There are two ways to receive the support. First, each zone will receive the financial support for organizing the zonal event around 20,000-25,000 USD. This supporting money may be used to help the teams. Second, AVC can support some equipment, not cash, to the National Federations for development or preparation for AVC events.

There was no question from Board of Administration Members to Mr. Cai Yi. The Zonal Activity Report was attached as Appendix 4.

Decision

The Eastern Zonal Activity Report was acknowledged. The proposal was not approved. The advise were acknowledged.

6.2.2 Western Zone

Mr. Malik referred to the Western Zone meeting in Indonesia during the Asian Games in 2018 regarding the decision to rename “Zone” to be “Association”. He insisted that only the name will be changed. The duty and action are remain the same.

Mr. Wei mentioned that the changes of name or internal structure are fine.

Mrs. Rita advised to officially confirm with FIVB before approving this proposal.

Mr. Graham has agreed with Mr. Malik’s proposal because this is the way to help each zone to open the bank account and fund raising.

Dr. Eom summarized that the name will be changed as follows:

From “Western Zone” to “Western Asian Association”;

From “Eastern Zone” to “Eastern Asian Association”;

From “Southeastern Zone” to “Southeastern Asian Association”;

From “Central Zone” to “Central Asian Association”;

From “Oceania Zone” to “Oceania Asian Association”.

The Board of Administration Members agreed to change the name but after receiving the FIVB approval.

The Zonal Activity Report was attached as Appendix 5.

Decision

The Western Zonal Activity Report was acknowledged. The proposal was approved with remarks.

6.2.3 Southeastern Zone

Mr. Shanrit Wongprasert reported about SEA Games in odd year and the SEA youth events in even year. AVC and FIVB competitions held in 2018 and to be held in 2019 in the Southeastern Zone including beach volleyball were also reported to the Meeting. The Zonal Activity Report was attached as Appendix 6.

Mr. Shanrit shared the FIVB’s information about the FIVB Development Project for receiving support from FIVB. Nowadays, FIVB is no longer support for courses, but focuses on National Federations’ teams. The application period is from 1st June 2019 – 15th July 2019. The circular letter about the FIVB Development Project was attached as Appendix 7.

Mr. Shanrit also informed the details of Asean Grand Prix for Women’s team with USD 100,000 prize money. For the first time, there will be at least two teams. The expected teams to participate are Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines, and Vietnam.

Decision

The Southeastern Zonal Activity Report was acknowledged and approved.

6.2.4 Central Zone

Dr. Davarzani reported all activities held in the zone including snow volleyball which was attached as Appendix 8. Kazakhstan will be organized FIVB Snow Volleyball in December.

Mr. Latheef added information about Maldives which organized 3 AVC Events in 2017, FIVB Qualification Beach Volleyball in 2018, and AVC Continental Cup Phase 1 in 2019.

Mr. Yermek mentioned about the participation of Iran and Kazakhstan in Snow Volleyball.

Mr. Hamza requested Dr. Davazarni, Mr. Yermek, and Dr. Eom to collaborate to organize first AVC Snow Volleyball Championship.

Decision

The Central Zonal Activity Report was acknowledged and approved.

6.2.5 Oceania Zone

Mr. Graham presented the Oceania Zonal Report which was attached as Appendix 9, on behalf of Mr. Craig Carracher. Mr. Graham informed about the decision of changing the leadership of President of Oceania Zone in Cancun.

Mr. Graham reported all activities held in the zone. He informed that Bank account of Oceania Zone has opened in Guam and Marshall Islands.

Mr. Hamza confirmed the position of Mr. Craig and Mr. Graham as follows:

- Mr. Hugh Graham is President of Oceania Asian Association;
- Mr. Craig Carracher is AVC Zonal Vice President of Oceania Zone and Vice President of National Team of Oceania Asian Association.

Mrs. Rita gave a warning about the way that Oceania Zone used to deliver the message about the important changes. She suggested that if there are any changes about Headquarters, President or Vice President of each zone, or any strong decision, they should officially inform the Board of Administration in advance. Due to the lastest Oceania meeting which was held in Cancun during FIVB World Congress, no one has been aware of the Oceania Zone's election except Dr. Ary Graca which was not right.

Mr. Graham confirmed and affirmed that Mr. Craig, Mr. Graham, Mr. Terry, and other Oceania Members are still in good relationship.

Mr. Wei informed that Oceania Zone is not independent organization, so the official notification in advance is required and respected. The problem or issue in Asian region should be firstly fixed within Asian before other knew.

Mr. Sasser insisted as well that this transition is very peaceful and none of any issue has been appeared after the transition. He also affirmed that Oceania is not independence from Asia.

Decision

The Oceania Zonal Activity Report and the changing after Oceania Zone Meeting in Cancun were acknowledged and approved.

6.3 Report of FIVB Board of Administration regarding FIVB decision about Asian Volleyball Confederation. The details as appeared in Appendix 10.

Mr. Shanrit summarized the FIVB decision that related to AVC. He mentioned there is no support to AVC.

Mr. Shanrit informed that FIVB settled up a new commission, which is Snow Volleyball Commission. The only Asian representative that nominated from FIVB is China.

Decision

The FIVB Board of Administration Report was acknowledged and approved.

AGENDA 7. AVC FINANCIAL STATEMENT REPORT AND AUDITOR'S REPORT

7.1 AVC Financial Statement Report

Mr. Hamza, AVC Treasurer and AVC Finance Committee Chairman made the report of 2018 AVC Financial Report, 2019 and 2020 AVC Budget. He informed the Board of Administration that the AVC income was reduced because the financial support from FIVB was cut-down. Mr. Hamza also mentioned that fortunately AVC has continual support from SMM – AVC Media Partner until 2023.

The 2018 AVC Financial Report was appeared in Appendix 11.

Decision

The 2018 AVC Financial Report was acknowledged and approved.

7.2 AVC Auditor Report

Mr. Waleed confirmed that balance sheet and the related statements of revenue and expenditures of AVC for the year of January 1st 2018 to December 31st 2018 were presented fairly in all materials respect on the financial position of AVC.

The AVC Auditor Report was appeared in Appendix 12.

Decision

The AVC Auditor Report was acknowledged and approved.

7.3 Independent Auditor Report

The representative from Thana-Ake Advisory Limited who is AVC Independent Auditing Company has confirmed that balance sheet and the related statements of revenue and expenditures of AVC for the year of January 1st 2018 to December 31st 2018 are presented fairly in all materials respect on the financial position of AVC.

The Independent Auditor Report was appeared in Appendix 13.

AVC Board of Administration Members requested AVC Financial Committee to decide what should they do with the money in the bank account such as invest in bond or equity for some return or leave in the bank for some interests. Then, AVC Financial Committee will propose the solution to the AVC Board of Administration.

Decision

The Independent Auditor Report was acknowledged and approved.

7.4 AVC Budget of 2019 and 2020

Mr. Hamza presented the 2019 and 2020 AVC Budgets.

The 2019 and 2020 AVC Budgets were appeared in Appendix 14.

Mr. Jehad advised that AVC should sell the TV rights of other events which SMM did not buy.

Mr. Wei mentioned about selling the TV rights of Qualification Event such as Olympic Qualification Tournament.

Mrs. Rita asked to prepare the project for getting the support from FIVB.

AVC Board of Administration Members agreed to ask Mr. Shanrit to send the project within July 15, 2019. The project should be include expense for each event but not include the detail of SMM's support.

Decision

The 2019 and 2020 AVC Budgets were acknowledged and approved.

7.5 Proposal of AVC Finance Committee

7.5.1 The audited financial statements and report have been reviewed by the Finance Committee and agreed that they correctly reflected the financial position of the AVC and as such were recommended to be put to the AVC Board of Administration Meeting and if approved to the AVC General Assembly;

7.5.2 The Finance Committee is concerned with the quantum of outstanding penalties owed by various NF's, as a result the Committee recommendation that where a NF has outstanding penalties that teams representing that NF are not allowed to participate in AVC or FIVB competitions until such time as the penalties are remitted in full (a list of outstanding penalties is attached in Appendix 15);

7.5.3 As a result, in the reduction of sponsorship and development funding the subsidy levels for events has significantly altered. The SEC & BC should send out information to advise the NF's of these changes and revise the conditions surrounding events. They should also clarify the process surrounding nomination of control committees and neutral referees to minimize costs by having people from nearby cities to the event fill these rolls.

Mr. Graham proposed to allow the national federations to pay in installation form but all payments have to fully pay within December 31, 2019.

Decision

Proposals of AVC Finance Committee were acknowledged and approved.

AGENDA 8. APPROVAL AND RATIFICATION FOR THE REPORT AND PROPOSALS OF CHAIRMAN OF TECHNICAL COMMITTEES.

8.1 Report of AVC Sports Events Council

Dr. Eom Han-Joo, Chairman of Sports Events Council, made the report and proposed the proposal to the meeting.

8.1.1. AVC SEC proposed new competition formats to be used from 2020. The current competition format used up to 2017 had a total duration of 9-days competitions including 1 resting day. New competition format which is the modification of the original one has a 8-days competition period with a less number of total matches. For each number of participating teams (8-16 teams) the new format has 3-4 options to choose depending on the conditions of facilities, personnel, and budget.

8.1.2. AVC SEC proposed that AVC should try to create a commercially-based senior level of invitational tournament in order to replace with “AVC Cup”. SEC proposes the new event will be named as “AVC “Sponsor” Cup” (this opinion was also proposed last year).

8.1.3. AVC SEC proposed that AVC Challenge Cup is organized in even year only for those teams which have a ranking of 9th or lower in the Senior Championship held in one year before and this event is not considered as a “must-do” event, but an optional event depending on the host availability and the number of participating teams.

8.1.4. AVC SEC proposed that AVC Video Challenge has been applied from 2019, but its use should be limited only to the AVC Senior competitions, and only to top 8-teams matches after Preliminary Round in the main venue (in case of multiple competition venues are being used).

8.1.5. For Asian Olympic Qualification in January 2020, SEC proposed the principles and standards for the selection of a potential host as follows:

- 1) Competition Dates: 2nd week of January, 2020 for both Men and Women
- 2) Participating teams:
 - a) (4-8 teams) from the AVC Senior Championship in 2019. If the participating teams are less than 8 teams, No team from a next ranking shall be included in the event.

3) Competition formats:

- a) 4-5 teams: Round Robin
- b) 6 teams: Round Robin or 2 pools (Round Robin and Cross-Elimination)
- c) 7-8 teams: 2 pools (A and B) – Round Robin and Cross-Elimination
- d) No ranking matches will be conducted. Teams are responsible for their return flight arrangement by themselves.

NOTE:

- a) In case of 6 teams, the host has a right to choose a competition format
- b) In case of 2 pools, the top 4 teams in the previous Sr. Championship (2019) will be seeded by the serpentine system, and the remaining teams will be assigned by drawing of lots. However, the host has a right to choose 1 team to be on the host's pool in case of 6 and 7 teams, and the remaining teams will be assigned in the other pool automatically.

4) Criteria for the evaluation of potential host candidates (bidding details)

- a) A minimum of US 100,000 hosting fees (up to US 200,000)
 - b) Readiness of the requirements of FIVB and AVC host conditions
 - c) All host accommodation and transportation conditions for the participating teams.
 - d) Contributions to AVC - the number of participations in AVC events and also the number of organizing AVC events in the past.
- 8.1.6 AVC SEC proposed to have laundry service for AVC Officials 2 pieces a day which are not included jacket.

Decision

Proposals of AVC Sports Events Council were acknowledged and approved.

Mr. Jehad proposed two proposals;

1. The tentative calendar should be 4 years instead of 2 years.
2. Increase the partial payment charges for all participating teams from USD 60 to either USD 70 or 80 to attract more host countries to be able to organize the events.

Dr. Eom explained that normally AVC has circulated 4 years-term but normally the host countries always sent back only 1 or 2 years term. For the partial payment, if the partial payment increased then it may effect some countries. So, Dr. Eom recommended to increase the partial payment to only senior level. For the junior championship, the host can use 4 stars hotel instead of 5 stars hotel.

AVC SEC will study about the rate of partial payment and inform the next Board of Administration Meeting.

8.2 Report of AVC Beach Volleyball Committee

Mr. Shanrit, AVC Secretary General, proposed the proposal to the meeting on behalf of Mr. Craig Carracher, Chairman of Beach Volleyball Committee.

8.2.1. Continental Cup Phase 2 and Phase 3 hosts – call for Express of Interest again and confirm financial support from AVC.

8.2.2. AVC Beach Volleyball Championships in 2020 – confirm financial support from AVC for this event and call for Express of Interest.

8.2.3. Under 19 Asian Beach Volleyball Championships (qualification for World Championships in 2019) and AVC support and Express of Interest process.

8.2.4. AVC Tour (Masters and Tour events) 2019 Express of Interest and confirm AVC Support.

Decision

Proposals of AVC Beach Volleyball Committee were acknowledged and approved.

8.3 Report of AVC Referees Committee

Mr. Songsak Chareonpong, Chairman of Referee Committee, presented the report and proposed the proposal to the meeting.

8.3.1 AVC RC proposed the list of 24 volleyball referees for ratification as Asian Referee Candidates (19 men and 5 women). The name list of volleyball referees was attached as Appendix 16.

8.3.2 AVC RC proposed the list of 17 beach volleyball referees for ratification as Asian Referee Candidates (17 men). The name list of beach volleyball referees was attached as Appendix 17.

8.3.3 AVC RC proposed the list of referee qualified matches in 2018 to be approved as “Asian Volleyball International Referee”. The name list of volleyball referees was attached as Appendix 18.

8.3.4 AVC RC proposed the revised “AVC Refereeing Courses - General Regulations”. The Regulations of AVC Refereeing Courses were attached as Appendix 19.

8.3.5 AVC RC proposed two (2) Asian Volleyball Referee Candidate Course to be organized in 2019;

8.3.5.1 SRI (19-25 Aug 2019) Due to internal problem in Sri Lanka, the course will be postponed;

8.3.5.2 TPE (30 Oct-5 Nov 2019).

8.3.6 AVC RC proposed to organize Asian Beach Volleyball International Referee Candidate Course in 2020.

8.3.6.1 China (March 2020)

Decision

Proposals of AVC Referees Committee were acknowledged and approved.

8.4 Report of AVC Coaches Committee

Mr. Park Ki-Won, Chairman of Coaches Committee presented the report and proposed the proposal to the meeting.

8.4.1 To Develop National Team Coaches in Category 2 and 3 Asian Countries

8.4.1.1. AVC correspond with Category 2 & 3 countries to ask if they need assistance with a program to develop NT coaches. Ask them specifically what they want.

8.4.1.2. AVC Coaches Committee members to visit for 10 days to work with National Teams, Head Coaches and the players.

8.4.1.3. Focus on Technical training specifically

8.4.1.4. Report back to AVC CC

8.4.1.5. Next year subsequent visits to country – to check the progress

8.4.1.6. Regular Skype meeting with AVC CC

Draft Budget per National Team Program

Per diems USD\$100 x 10 = \$1 000

Flights = \$1 000 USD

Hotel = \$1 000 USD

Total = \$3 000 USD per program

8.4.2 To find and appoint new Coaching Course Instructors

8.4.2.1. AVC correspond with National Federations and request CVs of potential Coach Instructors.

8.4.2.2. National Federations should send no more than 5 names of new instructors.

8.4.2.3. CVs from applicants should include the following criteria

- a. Playing experience (Club and National Team)
- b. Coaching experience (Club and National Team), Best results achieved
- c. Language skills e.g. English ability
- d. Level of Education
- e. Age
- f. Computer skills
- g. Current Occupation
- h. Coaching qualification e.g. FIVB.

There is collaborate program called “Coaches Course for Teacher” which innovated from CEV to send two representatives from each confederation to join the Coach training program to develop the teams. CEV will cover all the expenses for two representatives. AVC Coaches Committee will nominate at least two representatives to participate this program.

Decision

Proposals of AVC Coaches Committee were acknowledged but not approved. Mr. Park agreed to send representatives to attend CEV Project.

8.5 Report of AVC Development and Marketing Committee

Mr. Rueangsak Siriphol, AVC General Manager, proposed the proposal to the meeting on behalf of Mr. Ramon Suzara, Chairman of Development and Marketing Committee.

8.5.1. Approval of the 2019 AVC Courses

8.5.2. Submit to FIVB a 3 year AVC Developmental Plan for 2019-2021

8.5.3. Production of 2nd AVC instructional video with assistance of Korea Volleyball Association and Thailand Volleyball Association in English language.

Dr. Davazarni requested AVC Development and Marketing Committee members to find more sponsors to help AVC's Financial.

Mr. Jehad pointed out about the important duties of Development and Marketing because all the proposals are focus only development, not marketing.

Most sponsors except Senoh came through AVC Headquarters instead of AVC Development and Marketing Committee.

Mr. Ali proposed to separate between development and marketing from each other.

Mr. Latheef asked AVC Development and Marketing Committee to propose AVC Marketing Plan. FIVB has no longer given the supporting money so AVC Development and Marketing Committee should have solid plan to get supporting money by getting the new sponsors.

Mr. Graham proposed to hire Marketing Company to help selling AVC events.

Decision

Proposals of AVC Development and Marketing Committee were acknowledged and approved with remarks. All the proposals from the members will be carefully studied by AVC Development and Marketing Committee Members to propose again to AVC Board of Administration Members.

8.6 Report of AVC Medical Committee

Dr. Rueangsak Siriphol, member of Medical Committee, on behalf of the Chairman Medical Committee, Dr. Yonus Popalzay, presented the report and proposed the proposal to the meeting.

8.6.1 AVC MC requests the AVC BA to consider in the nomination of Medical Delegate at AVC senior events in order to supervise the anti-doping activities, in supporting FIVB, IOC, and WADA (World Anti-Doping Agency)'s policy.

Decision

Proposals of AVC Medical Committee was acknowledged and approved.

8.7 Report of AVC Communication Committee

Mr. Preechachan Wiriyapong, Chairman of AVC Communication Committee, proposed the proposal to the meeting.

1. AVC shall nominate two press delegates for some major events, especially those held in two venues at the same time (if costs not exceed the limited budget)

Decision

Proposal of AVC Communication Committee No. 1 was acknowledged but not approved.

2. AVC shall consider to have a photographer member in the AVC Communication Committee so as to have a better understanding and cooperation with each other.

3. AVC Communication Handbook and Communication Operations Guideline should be available for the nominated Press Delegate to help him/her do the right things according to the given instruction. (Still on preparation process for producing the AVC Press Handbook for future use).

4. AVC Communication Committee members should have good command of spoken and written English and are good at working with Social Media.

Decision

Proposal of AVC Communication Committee No. 2-4 were acknowledged and approved.

As the host city for this important meeting, he is delighted to offer all members our famous Thai hospitality. If there is anything he can do to help with their stay, please do not hesitate to let him know. He wished all success to AVC in this meeting and all activities. He also wished all BA members a nice stay in Pattaya and returned home safe and sound.

AGENDA 3. OPENING AND WELCOME ADDRESS AVC President

Dr. Saleh A. Bin Nasser extended his sincere gratitude to Pol. Maj. General Anan Charoenchasri, Mayor of Pattaya City for welcoming all of members. AVC President also welcomed all AVC Board of Administration members for their attention. After AVC HQ has been moved to Bangkok, AVC receives strong support from government and TVA in every aspect. Attending the BA meeting was a good opportunity to learn and develop volleyball in our confederation. He also appreciated all attendants to make this annual meeting success.

Mr. Hamza informed all the members that Mr. Mohamed Habib Ali passed away three weeks ago. Mr. Mohamed Habib Ali was Chairman of AVC Referee Committee and Secretary of FIVB Rules of the Games Commission for many years. All members had one minute of silence for paying respect to him.

AGENDA 4. APPROVAL OF AGENDA (as attached in Appendix 1).

Decision

The agenda was approved with a remark of Mr. Hamza to add the matter of, Federation Ivorinne de Volleyball (Ivory Coast), one African Volleyball Federation, regarding proposal to change the term of the President of International Volleyball Federation in Miscellaneous Agenda.

AGENDA 5. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE 39TH BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION MEETING IN BANGKOK, THAILAND ON MAY 14, 2017 (as attached in Appendix 2).

Mr. Craig Carracher asked the Board of Administration Members to take the American Samoa's case for consideration as the case was missing from the Minutes of The 39th Board of Administration Meeting. He explained how important the American Samoa's participation under their own flag is and asked for solutions. The Board agreed to include American Samoa's case in the Minutes, while Mr. Wei Jizhong added that in terms of the membership, AVC has no right to do with the FIVB membership.

Decision

The minutes was approved with a remark of Mr. Craig Carracher to add the matter of American Samoa to the Minutes of The 39th Board of Administration Meeting.

AGENDA 6. REPORTS

6.1 President's Report

AVC President extended his gratitude to Mr. Wei, all EC, Board of Administration Members, and Chairmen of AVC Technical Committees for their great support and contribution. He reported and proposed all the activities in 2017 to all affiliated federations in 22nd AVC General Assembly for consideration and approval. Last year, AVC had received strong cooperation and support from all members and National Federations in conducting our activities in very high level. He did hope to receive the same strong support in all the coming activities.

Mr. Craig Carracher remarked on the AVC President's report, citing that he praised the way the AVC President has reported which made a good sign of AVC's full support to NFs, excellent coordination of those NFs and dedication of the AVC President. He requested Dr. Nasser to be at the competition for celebrating the great success in events together.

The details as appeared in Appendix 3.

Decision

The report and comments were acknowledged and approved.

6.2 Zonal Activities Reports

6.2.1 Eastern Zone

Mr. Cai Yi reported the Eastern Zone activities. There was no question from Board of Administration Members to Mr. Cai Yi. He requested AVC to support Mongolia. The Zonal Activity Report was attached as Appendix 4.

6.2.2 Western Zone

Mr. Malik informed that some countries were inactive because of war, or suspension. However, this year, Iraq promised to do more activities in Volleyball. There was no question from Board of Administration Members to Mr. Malik. He also asked AVC to support Western Zone countries. The Zonal Activity Report was attached as Appendix 5.

6.2.3 Southeastern Zone

Mr. Shanrit Wongprasert explained about the management of the zone. Southeastern Zone meeting will be held on May 31, 2018 in Thailand. AVC and FIVB competitions held in 2017 and to be held in 2018 in the Southeastern Zone including beach volleyball were also reported to the Meeting. The Zonal Activity Report was attached as Appendix 6.

Mrs. Rita Subowo briefly reported on updated information on the 18th Asian Games in Indonesia that beach volleyball will be held in Palembang and volleyball in Jakarta during August 20 to September 1, 2018.

6.2.4 Central Zone

Dr. Davarzani reported all activities held in the zone both in competitions and seminars. There was no question from Board of Administration Members to Dr. Davarzani.

6.2.5 Oceania Zone

Mr. Craig Carracher reported all activities held in the zone. According to Australian Government's budget, he informed the Board of Administration Members that Australian Government has planned to support Oceania Zone for Pacific Sport Partnerships Program. He thanked AVC for entrusting Oceania Zone to host qualifying tournaments for FIVB U19 World Beach Volleyball Championships, Youth Olympic Games, and Commonwealth Games which are important international events.

Decision

The Zonal Activity Reports were acknowledged and approved.

Mr. Hamza informed all Zonal Vice Presidents that Molten has proposed to sell the Molten ball at discount price 15 USD per ball. AVC has planned to order the balls and will send to the national federations. But we have still had the problems of shipment and import tax which is more

expensive than the balls. For example, Bangladesh is facing the problem of receiving balls and cannot be solved. So the only way is to ask some teams to bring the balls to the Development Center or the hosts of AVC Championships who can distribute the balls to nearby federations, like in Bahrain during Men's U20 Championship. The same procedure can be done in other zones.

For the zonal meeting in 2017, only 5,000 USD had spent for the zonal meeting which was Southeastern Zone. AVC has requested all Zonal Vice Presidents to organize zonal meeting and AVC will support the mentioned amount after receiving the report.

Mr. Craig Carracher asked about the FIVB supporting money for each zonal activities including meeting for 25,000 USD. Mr. Craig and Mr. Shanrit confirmed that the zonal report have already submitted since 2015. Mr. Craig gave further information on situations at the FIVB Development Department, citing that all information and activities reports from each zone have already been submitted to the Department, but he was unsure if the transfer of the US\$25,000 for each zone has already been made or not. Mr. Hamza confirmed that the subsidy of 25,000 USD which has planned to allocate to the zone is still available in the budget.

Mrs. Rita Suwobo suggested that each NF can communicate directly with FIVB Development Department and send them full activity report for consideration. Then, she proposed to nominate one person who will be coordinator between FIVB Development Department and AVC. This coordinator has to have information such as which project will be allowing to receive the support. Also this person will need to prepare a long term project for the future. The members have agreed to nominate Mr. Ramon Suzara, who is a member of FIVB Development Commission, to be the coordinator for this matter. His responsibility is to take care of all kinds of fund and development projects. Also, the members asked Mr. Ramon and Mr. Shanrit to send the letter to FIVB Development Department about the procedure of receiving the supporting money from FIVB because some zones have submitted but the support have been received.

Moreover, Mr. Hamza explained about the FIVB annual fees for NFs, citing that each Zone must send their full details of the activity reports in terms of the competitions to FIVB Development Department to receive the budget allocated by the FIVB because each zone is under the FIVB's umbrella.

Decision

The B/A members have nominated Mr. Ramon Suzara as coordinator between FIVB Development Department and AVC.

6.3 Report of FIVB Board of Administration regarding FIVB decision about Asian Volleyball Confederation. The details as appeared in Appendix 7.

No specific committee for snow volleyball will be settled. Sports Events Council will take care the events of snow volleyball.

Decision

The FIVB Board of Administration Report was acknowledged and approved.

6.4 Report of Beach Competition in Commonwealth Games.

Mr. Craig Carracher, AVC Vice President for Oceania Zone and Australian Volleyball Federation President made the report. He mentioned that this was the first time in the history that beach volleyball was put in the Commonwealth Games. It was the successful game and be the number one sport. From this success, he thanked Dr. Graca, FIVB President and Mr. Hamza, FIVB Representative for their support. He also hoped that beach volleyball will be put in the next Commonwealth Games in Birmingham, England.

Mr. Graham will request the Organizing of Commonwealth Games in Birmingham, England in 2022 to have beach volleyball in the program. Then, he will send the letter to Dr. Ary Graca, FIVB President to push beach volleyball to be included in Commonwealth Games in 2022.

Decision

The Beach Competition in Commonwealth Games Report was acknowledged and approved.

AGENDA 7. THE CURRENT SITUATION OF NFS

7.1 India

FIVB requested Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and both sides of the NF to conduct the election of the BA under the supervision of IOA and FIVB within 6 months and the suspension will be lifted as soon as FIVB receives the official approval letter from IOA. The provisional suspension will be extended for another 6 months or as soon as after receiving the mentioned letter from IOA.

7.2 Philippines

The President of NOC has changed but the NF has still run the activities. If there is no official letter against the current NF, FIVB will propose the coming World Congress to approve the current NF as FIVB affiliated federation.

7.3 Kuwait

The IOC and Kuwait government have negotiated to finalized the situation. FIVB has to wait for IOC decision.

7.4 American Samoa

The case has been finalized between NOC and both sides of the NF so the suspension is lifted. The details as appeared in Appendix 8.

Decision

The current situations of 4 National Federations were acknowledged and approved.

AGENDA 8. AVC FINANCIAL REPORT & AUDITOR'S REPORT

Mr. Hamza, AVC Treasurer and AVC Finance Committee Chairman, and Mr. Riad Tayeh, AVC Finance Committee Secretary, made the report of 2017 AVC Financial Report, 2018 and 2019 AVC Budget. Both informed the Board of Administration that the AVC income was reduced because the financial support from FIVB was cut-down. Under this circumstance, AVC financial situation will not be in a good way in the future. Mr. Hamza also mentioned that fortunately AVC has SMM support until 2019, after that nobody knows how much AVC will receive the support. Then, AVC must reduce the Development Program in the coming 2 years.

Mr. Tayeh informed the Board of Administration the budget of the year 2018-2019.

The members asked Mr. Wei Jizhong to help to get the uncollectable money of 2015-2016 from Nike Sports (China). The lawyer hiring is allowed if needed.

Mr. Sasser proposed to increase the using of money for Press and Website. Most of people were not happy with AVC Website. Mr. Preechachan confirmed that AVC Website is recently improved and up-to-date. Mr. Preechachan explained that the problem is the design of the website which is too complicated. The members agreed to improve the social media. The details of number of viewer and follower of 5 Confederations as appeared in Appendix 11. Mr. Preechachan excused that China cannot use the Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram so the number of viewer and follower is less.

Mr. Carracher proposed to use the video conference for the technical committee meeting to save money and time.

The 2017 AVC Financial Report, Internal and External Auditor's Report, and Budget for 2018 and 2019 were attached as Appendix 9.

Decision

The AVC Financial Report, Internal and External Auditor's Report, and Budget for 2018 and 2019 were acknowledged and approved.

Proposal of AVC Finance Committee Member to AVC

- Considering writing letter to FIVB for zonal support grants;
- Approval of Financial Report 2017 and auditor's report 2017;
- Approval of 2018 Budget;
- Approval of 2019 Budget;

The Contract of Genius Sport was attached as Appendix 10.

All members agreed not to sign contract because of the conditions about the rights of Genius Sport to use, store, distribute, publish, adapt, supply, sub-license and/or exploit data and statistics (including live scoring data and historical scoring data) in respect of the Competitions. AVC will assign one specialist and one lawyer to study carefully about the contract.

Decision

The Proposals were approved except Genius Sport contract.

AGENDA 9. APPROVAL & RATIFICATION FOR THE REPORT & PROPOSALS OF CHAIRMEN OF TECHNICAL COMMITTEES.

9.1 Report of AVC Sports Events Council

Dr. Eom Han-Joo, Chairman of Sports Events Council, made the report and proposed the proposal to the meeting.

- 9.1.1 Update the AVC Sport Handbook;
- 9.1.2 Develop AVC-version e-Score Computer Program;
- 9.1.3 Elimination of AVC Cup from 2020 - Replace with a new form;
- 9.1.4 2020 Olympic Qualification Tournament and Asian Qualification Tournament Process;
- 9.1.5 The obligation of National Entry for AVC official events.

Mr. Al-Kuwari proposed to be aware of competition date. He requested to provide enough gap for each competition which the members also agreed.

For the 18th Asian Games, 18th August is the Opening Ceremony, 19th August will start with Women's Competition and then Men's Competition will be on 20th August.

For the 2019 World Beach Games, Beach Volleyball 4 a side will be held in San Diego, United States of America.

The members have agreed to inform FIVB that AVC will organize the Olympic Continental Qualification Tournament in October 2018 instead of January 2019.

Decision
The Proposals were approved.

9.2 Report of AVC Referees Committee

Mr. Songsak Chareonpong, Chairman of Referee Committee, presented the report and proposed the proposal to the meeting. The Regulations of AVC Refereeing Courses were attached as Appendix 12.

- 9.2.1 Proposed the list of 24 referees for ratification as Asian Referee Candidates to AVC Board of Administration.
- 9.2.2 Proposed revised "AVC Refereeing Courses - General Regulations" to AVC Board of Administration.

9.2.3 Proposed one (1) Asian Referee Candidate Course (ARCC) Volleyball to be conduct in KOR. Unfortunately, KOR cannot run this course, AVC RC proposed to transfer to Bangkok, Thailand on 5-11 September 2018.

9.2.4 Proposed one (1) Asian Referee Candidate Course (ARCC) Beach volleyball to be conducted in Thailand. (Date TBD)

Decision

The Proposals were approved.

9.3 Report of AVC Coaches Committee

Dr. Eom Han-Joo, presented the proposal to the meeting on behalf of Mr. Park Ki-Won, Chairman of Coaches Committee.

9.3.1 Coaching Aid Program (CAP) is launched for a developing country in Asia to help their national team training. - When requested, a maximum of two coaches are selected by the Coaches Committee and sent to the requested team with their own expenses (accommodation costs for a maximum of 1 week).

9.3.2 AVC supports and allocates some budget for the production of weight fitness training system (with video) for Asian teams in order to develop and increase the performance level of Asian athletes.

9.3.3 Technical seminars for serving skills which are particular to Asian athletes are needed in order to develop strong and efficient serving techniques to deal competitively with world class levels.

Decision

The Proposals were approved.

9.4 Report of AVC Beach Volleyball Committee

Mr. Craig Carracher, Chairman of Beach Volleyball Committee presented the report and proposed the proposal to the meeting.

9.4.1 The Committee members who have failed to attend the Beach Committee meeting two times continuously will be replaced by the members, recommended by Beach Volleyball Committee Chairman and approved by BA Meeting.

9.4.2 AVC considers additional steps to encourage NFs to participate in beach volleyball programs in Asia. 43 National Federations have never participated in AVC Beach Volleyball Tournaments. In particular, the Committee-members and Board members should actively encourage participation of their own NF. The AVC Beach Committee will review of beach volleyball opportunities with FIVB Beach Commission to determine the opportunities to align the AVC Beach Volleyball Tour with the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour as CEV has recently announced, in compliance with SMM and Sponsorship contracts.

9.4.3 The Board of Administration approves the 2019 FIVB Beach Volleyball World Championship Qualification process of AVC to include:

9.4.3.1 Only the ranking of AVC Beach Volleyball Tour events and Asian Beach Volleyball Championships after 1 September 2018 will have the points as qualification tournaments for 2019 BVB World Championship.

9.4.3.2 The Multi-Sport Events will not be included in the AVC rankings and that rankings will be determined on a National Federation basis not individual athlete qualification basis.

9.4.3.3 All AVC events will be used in the calculation.

9.4.3.4 Subject to FIVB Regulations, two teams per NF per gender can qualify through the AVC Continental Qualification Program.

9.4.4 The AVC Continental Cup format shall be as follows:

9.4.4.1 Each Zone will host one round of the CC to determine the top 2 ranked teams for men and women to participate in the AVC Continental Cup Finals. Each Zone will retain their two positions on the basis that 50% or more NOCs participate in the qualification tournament in their zone or participated on FIVB World Tour events during the FIVB Olympic Qualification Period, per gender. If a Zone does not submit 2 teams, these positions will not be allocated to other Zones. The format for the CC Finals will be determined when final numbers are agreed but it will likely be Single Elimination. Each match will be a Best of 3 with a Golden Match (not Golden Set).

9.4.4.2 The AVC Continental Cup Finals will include up to 10 teams from 5 Zones male and female PLUS the Host PLUS the 2016 Continental Cup Champion Nation. A maximum of 12 nations to participate in the Finals.

9.4.4.3 The Ranking at the Finals will be determined by AVC Rankings (with usual regulations for the Host if seeded in the top 4 teams). Rankings will be calculated from 1 July 2019 to 28 June 2020 as at the date of the Continental Cup Finals.

9.4.4.4 Bids for Hosting must be received before the commencement of the Ranking Period (i.e. before 1 July 2019, and the AVC Beach Volleyball Committee will recommend the host at the 2019 May Board meeting).

Dr. Davazarni proposed to organize 1st AVC Snow Volleyball Tournament in Iran in very near future.

Decision

The Proposals were approved.

9.5 Report of AVC Development and Marketing Committee

Mr. Ramon Suzara, Chairman of Development and Marketing Committee, presented the report and proposed the proposal to the meeting.

9.6.2 Health Management Program for Referees: This FIVB program was conducted for referees who have over-limited abdominal circumference, blood pressure, and BMI. The referees in this program must send a report about their health every 4 months. There are 22 referees in HMP for AVC. AVC MC requested all concerned NFs to pay attention to this program.

Decision

The Proposals were approved.

Dr. Davazarni proposed to replace Dr. Ramin Tabatabaei, member of AVC Medical Committee Member because he was elected as the President of Iranian Basketball Federation. The IRI proposed Dr. Gholam Reza Nowrouzi to replace Dr. Ramin. The detail of replacement of Dr. Ramin Tabatabaei was attached as Appendix 13.

Decision

The Replacement Proposal was approved.

9.7 Report of AVC Press Committee

9.7.2 The next Communication Seminar shall be conducted.

Sports Events Counsel explained the new competition format of AVC competitions. As there are only 8 teams in AVC Eastern Zone, if the new competition format is applied, there will be one more competition day compared to the current format. 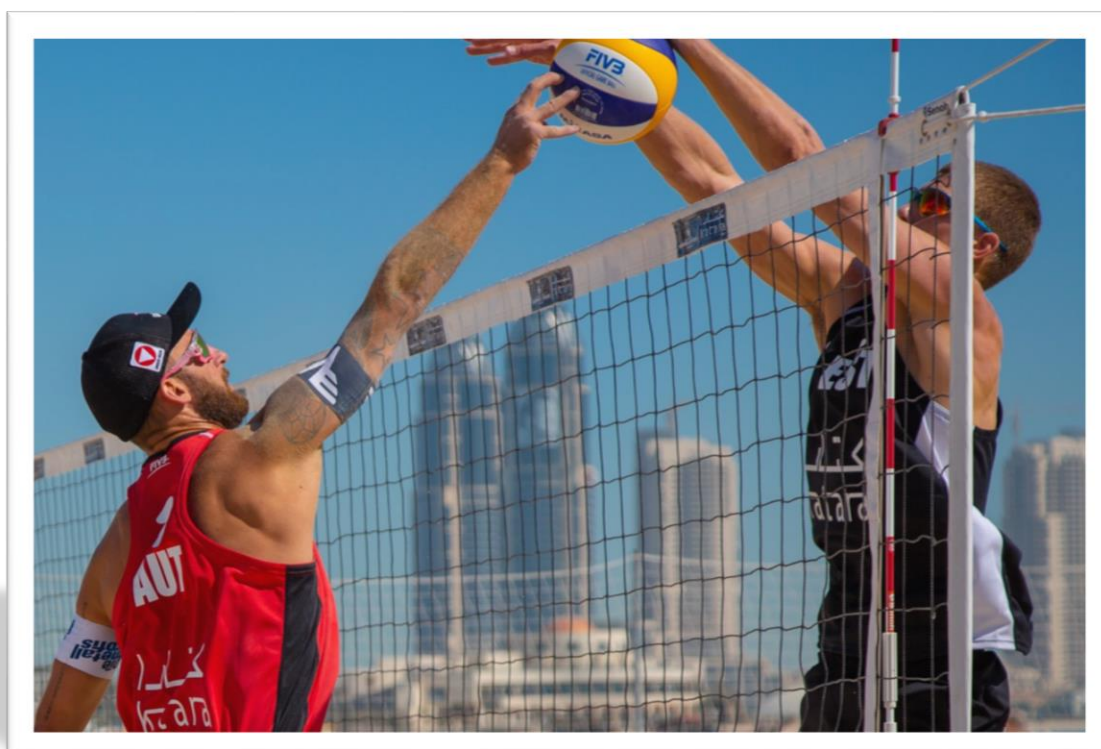

The FIVB Development Projects Platform is open to all National Federations who wish to apply for one of the three types of projects outlined below, as well as access to Volleyball E-learning on request :-

- A. Coaching support for technical & tactical development of national teams
 - 1. Coaching support for up to 12 months for Category 3, 4 & 5 National Federations
 - 2. Coaching support for up to 3 months for Category 1 & 2 National Federations
- B. Volleyball equipment
 - 1. Volleyball floors
 - 2. Volleyballs, beach volleyballs and kids volleyballs
 - 3. Volleyball nets and net systems
- C. Coach The Coaches
 - 1. High Performance Coaching clinics

Please find below some more information regarding each type of project:

- A. Coaching support for technical & tactical development of national teams

There is a budget established for this area, however the final approved total will be dependent on potential success of the project as well as the total number of applications. Projects will be assessed on criteria such as quality, demand and impact of the overall project goals.
- B. Volleyball equipment

With key partners such as Mikasa, Senoh and Gerflor providing volleyball equipment in kind, the FIVB will coordinate the allocation and distribution of volleyball equipment. There are set limits to the quantity that can be shipped to approved projects, e.g. a National Federation will be able to request up to 100 balls – volleyballs, beach volleyballs or kids' balls.

C. Coach The Coaches

This programme will provide an International Mentor Coach to conduct a course for Elite Coaches. This course aimed for the NF's best Coaches will be occasion where the Coach will coach the Coaches for a period of up to 10 days.

Volleyball e-learning (On Request)

As a further contribution to E-learning for coaches and officials, NF's can also request in the Projects Platform Application for access to the FIVB e-learning platform. Each approved project will require an agreement in contract form, which should be signed by both the FIVB and a National Federation by each respective President

- National Federation shall provide the Coach with the necessary health insurance.

Roles & Responsibilities

FIVB

- FIVB will make material donation and will deliver the Material, free of charge, to the main harbour of National Federation (or to the closest main harbour).
- The FIVB will then help the National Federation to liaise and coordinate the operations with Material Manufacturer, at no cost for the National Federation.

NATIONAL FEDERATION

- National Federation shall bear all and any custom taxes, import duties, taxes including VAT (if any), licenses fees taxes, storage costs and local transportation costs.
- National Federation shall arrange all the import licences with their respective governmental entity or get the custom exemption if needed.
- National Federation shall inform FIVB in writing of any changes that may arise or any special circumstances (i.e. bill of lading should be addressed to a certain Ministry, etc.), at least 1 month prior to the shipment.
- National Federation shall use its best efforts in order to ensure that the material will be released from customs within 30 days upon arrival at the main harbour of their Country.
- National Federation shall take care of the local transportation, from the main harbour of their country to the location.
- National Federation shall not sell or commercialize the Volleyball Equipment donation in any manner.

High Performance:

to provide high-performance services across coaching, sports science and analysis, as well as function as a high-performance training and competition venue.



Education:

to support the development and education of Volleyball/Beach Volleyball coaches and administrators from grassroots Volleyball through to elite Volleyball with courses and qualifications.

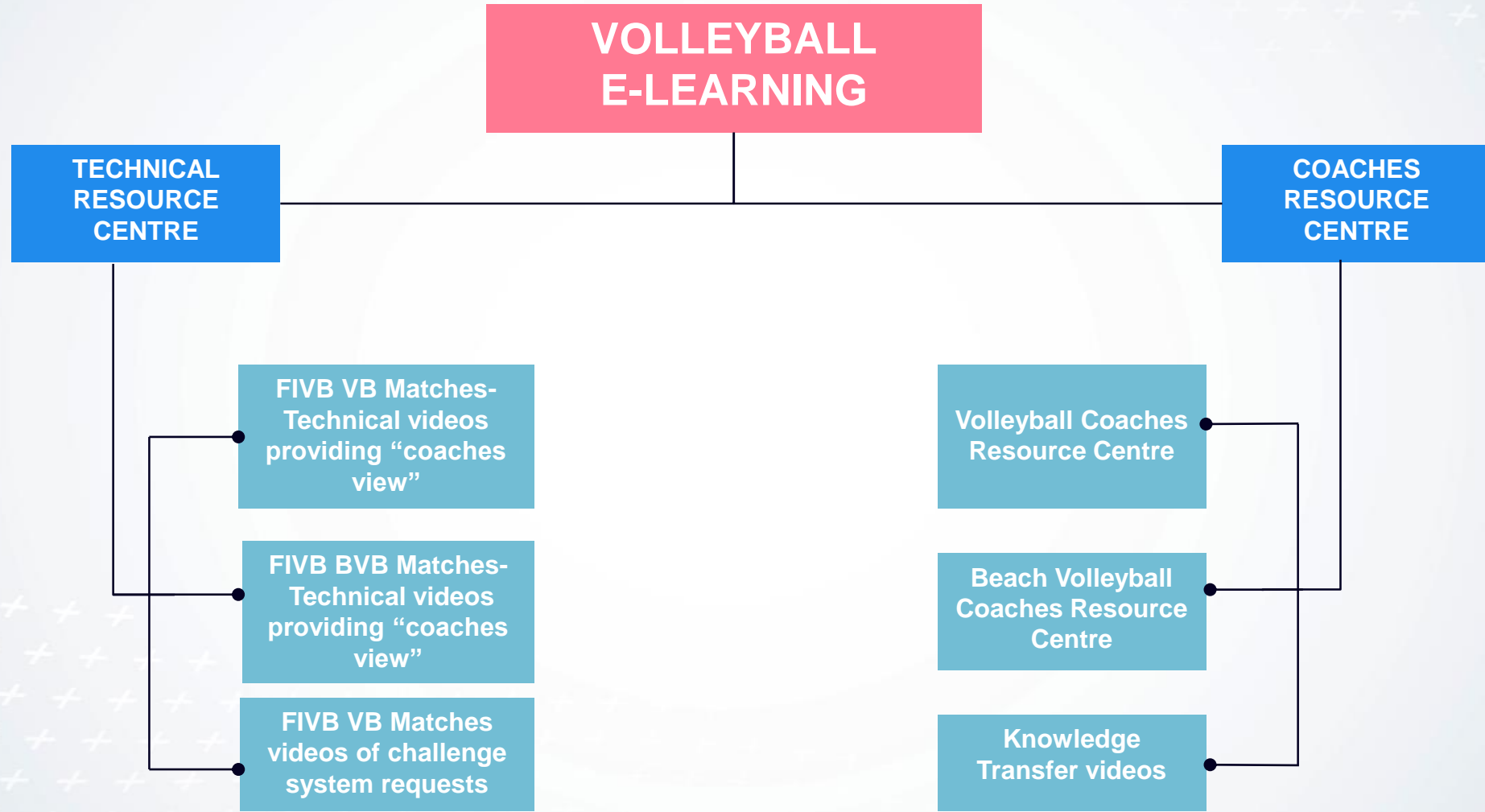

GENERAL CONDITIONS



Project Platform is an annual programme established to support NF's through an open application process for dedicated Coaching support, Volleyball equipment and Coach the coaches. This platform helps you to get the right support from the FIVB for improving the performance of your national teams, as well as fostering the growth of volleyball and beach volleyball in your country.



Only National Federations affiliated to the FIVB are eligible to apply online for 2019 FIVB Development Projects Platform support. The FIVB must have approved the final report of project Platform 2018 for your National Federation to be eligible for support in 2019.



Joint projects between National Federations are encouraged.




Applications for Coach Support must be submitted with budget (Template provided in application platform to download and complete).



NF receiving the VIK Goods donated from Projects Platform, they have 60 days to collect the goods and clear them from customs and take ownership of the donation or FIVB reserves the right to take position and seize the goods and reallocate them to another project.



National Federation can only apply for one project type per year. (1 project + E-learning on request)




Approved projects will require a signed agreement with FIVB prior to commencing. The agreement will be provided by FIVB. All 2019 projects with an agreement will be subject to monthly reporting, site visits and full audit at the discretion of FIVB.



All applications must be completed in full and submitted online before July 15, 2019 CEST 23:00.



FIVB has the right to terminate any project that does not meet the requirements of the agreement.



Exceptional circumstances will be considered on a case by case basis but must be requested in writing prior to deadline. In case of exceptional circumstances, FIVB templates for application, monthly monitoring reports and final reports of the project will be provided.

Oceania Zonal Volleyball Association

2018 & 2019 Update

Oceania Zonal Volleyball Association has seen more growth in the last two years than perhaps the previous two decades. From events to administration, there have been great gains.

The OZVA membership piggy-backed their annual general meeting with the FIVB Congress that was hosted in Cancun, Mexico. Volleyball Australia's President and former OZVA President Craig Carracher continues to mentor and forwarded the plan to have the small island countries lead the way. New OZVA President is Hugh Graham of Cook Islands. The new OZVA Secretariat/ Financial office is now open in the Marshall Islands overseen by new Secretary General/ Finance Director Terry Sasser. Newly elected Zonal Vice Presidents include: Morris

Maitaki, Vice-President of the Central Zone, which includes Australia, Fiji, New Caledonia, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Tuvalu, Vanuatu and Wallis and Futuna. Ben Sauvaio is the new Vice-President of the Eastern Zone, comprising American Samoa, Cook Islands, New Zealand, Niue, Samoa, Tahiti, Tokelau and Tonga. Herman Ada is Vice-President of the Western Zone, which includes Federated States of Micronesia, Guam, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Nauru, Northern Mariana Islands and Palau. The need for a Vice-President for high performance and national teams was unanimously elected and filled by Craig Carracher. Holding the AGM at the FIVB Congress brought great awareness to the work ahead and the necessity of aligning all OZVA's commissions, events and executive board to FIVB and President Ary Graça's goals. The meetings held with President Graça and AVC President Saleh A. Bin Nasser sparked great enthusiasm and vision.

One of the principle issues that OZVA felt it needed to address was the professional delivery of its events. Everything from referee and officials' uniforms to protocol and facilities all needed to be aligned with FIVB regulations. OZVA Events Commissioner James Summers was tasked, in addition to working with the host of each event, to professionalize event rollout and he expended great effort to implement this plan. A bid document was developed for host countries to complete and it was reviewed and refined, based on lessons learned over the past year, during the January 2019 board meeting. The tireless efforts of the 2018 hosting countries will culminate in Samoa in 2019 with the Pacific Games.

Australia organized the 2018 World Beach Volleyball Tour, a 1-Star event hosting 32 teams in Shepparton, Victoria in early February. Nine Australian teams placed.

The 2018 Oceania Inter Club Championship Games took place in late February and were officially opened by President of Fiji Volleyball Federation and OZVA Women's Commissioner, Ms. Nanise Vucago, at the FMF Gymnasium, Laucala Bay in Suva, Fiji. A total of 14 teams, 9 men's and 5 women's, played in the 29-game competition. The games were conducted in 3 teams per pool of 3 for men and 5 teams for women in a round robin match. More than thirty officials and volunteers were up-skilled and worked during the 3-day competition

The 2018 Commonwealth Games in Gold Coast, Australia in April brought great Oceania volleyball results: Australia's Beach Volleyroos had standout performances with men's gold and women's silver; Both New Zealand's men and Vanuatu's women achieved bronze.

June 2018 saw the introduction of the new Volleyball Nations League. The senior men's Volleyroos were invited to play as one of the 16 teams selected on competitive and marketing/ commercial grounds. The tournament represented a logistical challenge, with 15 matches played over 5 weeks in 4 different countries (Brazil, Argentina, Poland and Australia). It also brought significant challenges in managing the limited permitted player roster to enable adequate recovery between matches and to prevent injury, but it provided unparalleled competition. Of the 15 opponents, the Volleyroos placed 13th above China and Korea.

The Micronesian Games also served as the first OZVA Western Zone Championships for both indoor and beach and took place in Yap, Federated States of Micronesia, from July 15-27, 2018. Nine countries, states and territories represented both men's and women's beach and indoor volleyball. Clearly there has been great development in this zone, as teams that had not medaled in previous Micro Games shared the medal tally. After some hard-fought beach matches, the women's podium was topped by Palau and a double podium silver and bronze finish by Marshall Islands' teams 1 and 2, respectively. In the men's tournament, Palau cinched double beach gold, followed by a strong silver for Kiribati and bronze for Guam. The indoor tournament took place in Yap's newly constructed volleyball gym. FSM's Chuuk State edged out Palau for the gold medal in the men's tournament, while Kiribati captured bronze. In the women's competition, Team Marshall Islands found itself undefeated going into the gold medal match, beating Guam early in pool play, but Guam established its dominance in the gold medal game, leaving Marshall Islands with silver and Palau with bronze.

French Polynesia stepped up in the hosting department and scooped up hosting rights for both the 2018 Indoor and Beach Oceania Championships. In Noumea, New Caledonia in August, the Fijian men's team created history at the 2018 Oceania Volleyball Championship after beating powerhouse New Zealand 3-1 to win gold, while Samoa took bronze. Meanwhile, the Fiji women's team settled for silver after going down to New Zealand 3-1, with New Caledonia coming in third.

With 24 teams starting the World Championships competition, 16 progressed past the first round, including Australia, who recorded wins against Cameroon (ranked 30), Tunisia (24) and Slovenia (23). They played in a patient, yet uninhibited and fighting way – "the Volleyroos Way" – taking number 2 ranked team USA to 5 sets along the way. Australia finished 14th out of the 24 qualified teams overall, an improvement over the last World Championship result from 2014. Also, in September, the bronze medal of the FIVB World Tour Finals went to Australia's women's beach team.

The 2018 Oceania Beach Volleyball Championships were held in Papeete, Tahiti in December. Vanuatu defended their Oceania women's beach volleyball title for the third time in a row, denying Tahiti a clean sweep of the podiums. Top seeded Vanuatu defeated the Tahitians 2-0 in the final, having also beaten the hosts' top pair in the pool stages. Having just missed Rio Olympic qualification, Vanuatu's beach program is laser-focused on the road to Tokyo for the 2020 Olympic Games. In the men's beach tournament, Tahiti swept the medals, while Tuvalu just missed a podium finish with 4th place.

Once again it was evident in the preparation for these events, fully utilizing regional referees and officials, that there has been great momentum in up-skilling. The advanced shipment of OZVA assets to professionalize the look of the facilities continues to showcase Oceania's resolve toward the professional development of volleyball. Live web-streaming of competitions was another priority goal that was achieved this year.

Oceania is also strategically placed on various regional and international commissions, with AVC Board of Administration (BOA) member Craig Carracher leading the AVC Beach Committee, AVC BOA member Terry Sasser and Riad Tayeh (Australia) on the AVC Finance Committee, and AVC BOA member Hugh Graham on the AVC Development Committee.

OZVA is positioning itself to maximize all opportunities afforded by FIVB, AVC and Olympic Solidarity (OS) programs. This was demonstrated through a very successful OS Development of National Sport System (DNSS) grant to Federated States of Micronesia (FSM). OZVA, working with FIVB Development's Hitesh Malhotra, was able to certify regional experts, one of whom was Apenisa Saukuru of Fiji, who ran an athlete, coach and referee training in Yap State, FSM for several months leading up to the Micronesian Games. The effort to certify coaches is on-going. Due to the great success of the OZVA Western Zone / Micronesian Games Championships, the OZVA executive board agreed to allocated funds for the purchase of volleyball equipment for continued development of each NF following the Games in Yap and onward. The FIVB HUB grant proposals have benefitted numerous OZVA member federations and their successful implementation is ongoing. The Government of Australia's Pacific Sport Program (PSP) continues to assist in development through grants.

Looking ahead to a great year in 2019, the new board had its first meeting in January in Honolulu, Hawaii. The President, Secretary General/ Finance Director, Zonal Vice-Presidents and designated Commissioners addressed an aggressive agenda over three long days. We were fortunate to have FIVB Director for Asia and Oceania Luis Alexandre Rodrigues join the meeting to continue the efforts to align all aspects of OZVA to performance-based outcomes to meet the objectives set forth by FIVB. The key objective of this meeting was to address the neglected revision of a constitution with clear governance, statutes, job descriptions, all documents for incorporation and a strategic four-year development plan to be endorsed by the membership and presented to FIVB President Graça. A priority for the commissions is the development of a coach and referee education pathway, specifically a curriculum utilizing regional experts, which will flow into FIVB and AVC coach and referee level-1 programs, maximizing OS's Team Support, DNSS and Technical Course for Coaches and Officials (TCC) grants to do so. All of these matters were the concerns raised by the membership during the OZVA AGM and FIVB Congress and the new board is tasked with finding solutions and action plans.

The Asian Volleyball Confederation (AVC) is a volleyball sport organization in Asia and Oceania with 65 national federation members, established in 1952. AVC is under the International Federation of Volleyball (FIVB) in Lausanne, Switzerland. The main function of AVC is conducting and controlling all volleyball matters in Asia and Oceania. Main source of budget comes from the subsidy of FIVB, annual fees of members, transferring of professional players, and the privilege of related sponsors and suppliers.

The AVC Headquarters has moved to locate in Bangkok, Thailand since December 2014. AVC has transferred its budget from FIVB in Switzerland, AVC Treasurer in Kuwait, and the previous AVC Office in Beijing, China.

As AVC is the first Asian sport organization with its Headquarters located in Thailand, the most appropriate way to register according to Thai Laws, is evaluating. It is anticipated to be registered in 2015.

2 Significant Accounting Policies**2.1 Basic of Financial Presentation**

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Transactions in foreign currencies occurred during the year are translated into US\$ at the exchange rate on monthly average as determined by the Bank of Thailand for the transaction month. Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies outstanding at the end of the reporting period are retranslated into US\$ at the exchange rates prevailing on that date as determined by the Bank of Thailand. Gains or losses on retranslation are included in the statement of revenues and expenses.

2.2 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consists of cash on hand and bank deposits payable on demand.

2.3 Equipment / depreciation

Equipment is recorded at cost and depreciated on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets.

AVC REFEREEING COURSES GENERAL REGULATIONS (Edited 20 -3-2019)

These regulations apply to all refereeing courses endorsed by the Asian Volleyball Confederation (AVC). National Federations (NFs) seeking to conduct courses must be aware of these regulations as they apply to the level of course being applied.

1. GENERAL PRINCIPLES

National Refereeing, Asian International Refereeing Candidate, and Refresher Courses can only be **organized** by a National Federation (NF), FIVB Development Centre or **Asian Volleyball Confederation (AVC)**.

1.1 Courses that do not conform to these Regulations will not be granted AVC recognition

1.2 Refresher Courses do not qualify new referees but can be organised either at National or Asian level.

1.3 Category of Referee recognized by AVC

The following categories of referees are recognized by the AVC:

- a) National Referee
- b) Asian International Referee Candidate
- c) Asian International Referee
- d) FIVB International Referee Candidate
- e) FIVB International Referee

2. ASIAN INTERNATIONAL REFEREEING CANDIDATES COURSE (AIRCC)

2.1 CONDITIONS FOR AVC RECOGNITION

Only under the direction and approval of the AVC Refereeing Committee can AVC International Refereeing Candidate Courses be organised. Courses can be organised by National Federations affiliated to the AVC or the FIVB Development Centers based in Asia; provided procedures outlined **within these regulations** are duly followed.

A course program must provide full duration information **and a** standard agenda or program. **A course must have a minimum of four (4) National Federations included, fifteen (15) candidates.** Course participation will be capped at a maximum of twenty (20) candidates and an **examination** must be conducted; otherwise, participants will not receive formal attestation and the course results and outcomes will **NOT** be endorsed or validated by the AVC Refereeing Committee.

2.2 APPLICATION

2.2.1 Regular proposal

The NF or FIVB Development Centre wishing to organize an Asian International Referee Candidate Course (AIRCC) must apply in writing to AVC Head Office, **by November 30th of the year prior to hosting**, using the AVC proposed courses forms. The application form must be copied to the AVC RC Secretary and Chairperson for their information.

2.2.2 Late proposal

Late applications may be considered, they must be submitted a minimum of three (3) months before the first day of the proposed course; or submitted for endorsement by the AVC RC before the first day of the AVC Board meeting; whichever date is earlier

2.3 PARTICIPANTS

2.3.1 Entry conditions

Participants must be national referees of an Asian National Federation and must have been registered with the FIVB/**AVC** for at least three (3) years out of the past five (5) years. National Federations are responsible for checking the registration of their nominees with the FIVB/**AVC**

Each National Federation may nominate a maximum of two (2) candidates to attend an AIRCC; **the organizing National Federation may appoint three (3) candidates. An additional candidate from each participating country or organizer may be accepted, if a female referee is one of the proposed candidates.** In the case where more than **twenty(20)** nominations are received the AVC RC will decide on candidates to be accepted to the course.

Candidates not passing a course may be nominated again as candidates to an AIRCC by their National Federations, but must wait a minimum of twelve (12) months from the completion of the course they did not pass. Candidates will only be accepted to a maximum of two AIRCC, if they do not pass on the second attempt they will not be accepted to future AIRCC.

A National Federation can withdraw the participation of their candidate(s) without any consequence provided a minimum of thirty (30) days' notice is given before the official opening day of the AIRCC. If a candidate withdraws within thirty (30) days of the opening day, without acceptable reason, the NF will not have right to nominate any Candidate(s) to any AVC Refereeing Course until the end of the next calendar year.

Candidates will be required to complete an entry test to check their basic knowledge of the Official Volleyball Rules and English language; and will be required to meet the minimum medical levels as set by FIVB/AVC. (Candidates who do not fulfill this requirement will not be accepted to participate.)

The AVC reserves its rights to reject nominees who are found **not to be** in compliance with these Regulations.

2.3.2 Age limit

The minimum age of a nominee to participate in an Asian International Refereeing Candidate Course is twenty-five (25) and maximum age is forty-one (41) at any time during the year of the course being conducted. Evidence of age shall be via an official passport of the nominee's home country which contains at least the person's Year of Birth.

2.3.3 Medical

Each nominee must obtain, complete and provide the FIVB/**AVC** official Medical Certificate (Form C-R5) with their Individual Registration (Form C-R3). All candidates will follow an entry test to check their body mass index. Those participants who are found to not be in accordance with the established medical standards shall not be accepted to participate in the course.

2.3.4 Accommodation fee.

Each candidate will be responsible for his/her accommodation fee from arrival day **until day of** departure.

The **organiser** has **the** right to collect the accommodation fee from each participant, **of** not more than eighty (80) US dollars per day, **upon candidate(s) arrival into the host city.**

2.4 COURSE DIRECTOR **AND** INSTRUCTORS

The Course Director and Instructor, including second instructor where required, will be proposed by the AVC Refereeing Committee during the annual meetings within one calendar month of the course being endorsed by AVC. The proposed Director and Instructor/s will be proposed from among the list of endorsed **FIVB/AVC** Referee Instructors. Proposals will be directed to the AVC President or their delegate, for approval and formal nomination.

Second Instructor

If there are more than twenty (20) participants, or the practical activities are not to be conducted in one hall, the AVC Refereeing Committee will propose a Second Instructor, in accordance with the process outlined above **in accordance with AVC Financial situation.**

2.5 DURATION

To receive official approval a course must be no less than seven (7) days in length; ensuring that each participant will have a minimum of at least one match as first referee, and one match as second referee, **one match as Scorer, one match as Assistant Scorer and matches as line judge (in several locations)** during the practical sessions.

2.6 WORKING LANGUAGE

The working language of FIVB is English therefore all AVC courses must be conducted in the course to be English language. Lectures, written and oral examinations as well as all communications must be provided in English only.

The Course Director, or delegate, must check, before the beginning of each course, the candidates' basic knowledge of the Official Volleyball Rules and basic knowledge of English (written and oral). Candidates who do not fulfill this requirement will not be accepted to participate.

2.6.1 Interpreters are not allowed

The official course invitation letter to be sent to NFs, by the organizer, must clearly state that Interpreters will not be allowed; this information must also appear clearly in the Individual Registration Form.

3. ASIAN INTERNATIONAL REFEREE

3.1 To be endorsed as an Asian International Referees the referee must:

- Successfully pass an Asian International Referee Candidates Course
- Within five (5) years of successfully completing a course they must have been certified by an AVC Refereeing Committee member as having officiated a minimum of three Continental matches (or equivalent approved by AVC). Two (2) must be as first referee and one (1) as second referee.
- Endorsed events include, official Asian Championships, Zonal tournaments, including Qualification Tournaments where the Referee Delegate is appointed by the AVC RC.

Candidate referees will not be accepted to Asian Senior Volleyball Championships. From time to time other events may be excluded for Candidate referees, these will be advised to NFs when calling for accompanying referee nominations.

3.2 To be endorsed as an Asian Beach Volleyball International Referees the referee must:

- Successfully pass an Asian Beach Volleyball International Referee Candidates Course
- Within five (5) years of successfully completing a course they must have been certified by an AVC Refereeing Committee member as having officiated in official AVC recognized Beach Volleyball tournaments;
- completing complete an overall number of four (4) matches as first referee and four (4) matches as second referee.

3.3 The AVC will award an Asian International Referee Certificate and Identification card (ID) to those candidates finally proposed to the AVC Board, after

- ensuring that they have fulfilled the requirements as specified above; and
- received endorsement at the AVC Refereeing Committee annual meeting.

4. NATIONAL REFEREEING COURSES

Course conducted by National Federations are recognized by the AVC.

National Federations establish their own procedures for nomination of national referees and then may register them with the FIVB Volleyball Events Department (according to Articles 2.1.2.1 and 2.1.2.3, and FIVB Sports Regulations). Upon establishment of the AVC register, FIVB information will be transferred to AVC and NFs will be required to complete registration with AVC annually.

However, the AVC makes the following recommendations:

4.1 APPLICATION

Requests to conduct National Refereeing Courses with using an AVC appointed instructor must be submitted using the approved AVC Proposed Courses form.

Applications must be submitted to the AVC by **November 30th of each year** for courses to be conducted during the following calendar year.

4.2 PARTICIPANTS

4.2.1 Entry conditions

When a NF applies for the organization of a National Refereeing Course with an AVC Instructor and if no referee training exists in the host country, participants are expected to be former players or sportspersons whom have a good practical knowledge of Volleyball/Beach Volleyball.

4.2.2 Age limit

Candidates to be a minimum of eighteen (18) years to a maximum of thirty-five (35) years; or according to NF regulation and requirement.

4.2.3 Working language

National language (where an Instructor from AVC is not requested), English or Arabic (where Instructor from AVC is requested). Simultaneous translation into the national language may be provided by the organizer for National courses only.

4.2.4 Entries

Maximum of thirty-five(35) participants, with a minimum of two(2) instructors. In principle an entry fee may not be requested from participants; this is a decision of the organizing National Federation.

4.2.5 Medical

Good physical condition. The National Federation is requested to seek a medical certificate from all participants; the FIVB Medical certificate (Form C-R5) may be used.

4.3 INSTRUCTORS

Instructors shall be either the President or a member of the organizing National Federation's Refereeing Commission; an experienced International Referee or NF approved referee instructor. They shall have complete knowledge of refereeing theory (Official Volleyball Rules) and practice (Refereeing Instructions and Guidelines), as well as some teaching experience.

If AVC instructors are requested by the organizer for its national programs, they shall be proposed by the AVC Refereeing Committee at its annual meeting.

4.4 DURATION

The course will run for a minimum of five days; at least thirty-five (35) working hours, with a practical session consisting of a minimum of three sets per candidate.

5. REFRESHER COURSES

Refresher courses do not qualify new referees. These courses are aimed to update the referees' knowledge on the Official Volleyball Rules, Refereeing Guidelines and Instructions as well as their practical refereeing abilities. Drawing their attention to new Rules and there interpretation following the approval of new Rules and amendments at the FIVB Congress.

Refresher courses can be organized at the international level by FIVB Development Centre, AVC and National Federations.

5.1 APPLICATION

The organizer must apply in writing by **November 30th of each year to the AVC**, by using the AVC proposed courses forms, with copy to the AVC Referee Committee Secretary and Chairman, for their information.

5.2 PARTICIPANTS

5.2.1 Entry conditions

Participants may be either:

- International Referees and/or Asian International Referees (not nominated to FIVB or Continental competitions for two (2) years)
- FIVB International Referee Candidates or Asian International Candidate Referees.
- Highest level National Referees, registered for three (3) of the past five (5) years.

5.2.2 Working language

The official working language for the Refresher courses will be English. For National Referees, simultaneous interpretation to other languages may be permitted.

5.2.3 Entries

The number of participants is fixed by the organizer, taking into consideration the facilities for practical. To be granted official recognition a minimum of fifteen (15) to a

maximum of twenty-five (25) participants is required for the course. One third of the participants must be FIVB International, Asian International Referee or Asian International Referee Candidate.

5.2.4 Medical

Each participant must present the official Medical Certificate (Form C-R5).

5.3 INSTRUCTORS

A Course Director is nominated by the AVC, proposed by AVC Refereeing Committee at its annual meeting.

5.4 DURATION

The course must be up to five (5) days, depending on the number of participants.

6. TECHNICAL FACILITIES

The following list the minimum equipment and venue requirements that are to be provided by the organizer.

6.1 Lecture hall

- Lecture hall, equipped with seats and writing surface for all participants with adequate space for observers and interpreters where required
- Whiteboard with marker pens (different colours)
- Flip chart / “butchers paper” with marking pens
- Podium, table and chairs for course Director / Instructor/s
- LCD projector with various adapters / connectors / attachments for a variety of computers
- Overhead projector
- Video cameras, minimum of two (2)
- Video recorder and monitor are recommended
- Current Official Volleyball / Beach Volleyball Rules of the Game, Refereeing Guidelines and Instructions, Case Book; one copy for each participant in English only
- Score sheets, Libero Control sheets (R6) and Line-up (R5) sheets

6.2 Sports facilities and equipment

6.2.1 For Volleyball

- One (1) indoor Volleyball court for every sixteen (16) participants. This must be clean, regularly marked, well maintained and illuminated, with chairs and benches for all participants beside the court
- Scorers’ table, Score sheets (official international), Libero Control sheets (R6), Line-up sheets (R5) and flags for line judges
- Regular net for matches
- Podium, table, Chair for the Director / and Instructor/s

6.2.2 For Beach Volleyball:

- Beach Volleyball court(s), with all necessary court equipment
- Scorer's table with scoreboard, paddles 1 & 2 and two (2) chairs
- Chairs for the participants
- Volleyballs, manometer
- Four (4) line judges' flags

6.3 Teams - Players and personnel

6.3.1 For Volleyball

- High level teams for regular tournament (if possible International/National senior or junior) playing at least three (3) sets for each participant for practical refereeing and practical examination,
- Assistant personnel for the matches: minimum six (6) Ball-retrievers, minimum eight (8) Quick-moppers

6.3.2 For Beach Volleyball

- Sufficient teams and competition structure to enable full assessment of the candidates
- At the instructors' request, the players must demonstrate the different faults connected with ball touch and those made with various skills
- The teams play matches to give the course participants the opportunity to practice and demonstrate their level of competency
- Such matches may be organized during a tournament, but each participant must officiate at least three (3) matches as 1st and/or 2nd referee, and perform as line judge, scorer and assistant scorer.

7. FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

7.1 NATIONAL LEVEL

7.1.1 The organizer responsibility as follow

- Appointed Instructor's international air ticket, and a per-diem of USD100 / day from arrival day until departure day.
- **The organizer will provide** Instructor's accommodation and local transportation.
- Full board and lodging for the instructor.

7.2 ASIAN LEVEL

7.2.1 AVC will pay subsidies as follow

- **AVC will pay** International air ticket, per-diem and the Instructor USD 100 per day from arrival day until departure day.

7.2.2 The organizer responsibility

- Full board and lodging for instructors from arrival day until departure day.
- The organizer to prepare and take care of course equipment and facilities,
- Local transportation between the airport and hotel for instructor and participants.

- High level of national senior/Junior competition or international junior competition for the practical part and examination of the candidates, in which each candidate must have the possibility of officiating one complete match at least as first referee, second referee, scorer, assistant scorer and line judge under the control and supervision of the Director and Instructors.
- All court personnel as specified above.

8. PROGRAMME

The course must cover the following theoretical and practical subjects topics

8.1 General

- Organization of the FIVB and AVC
- History of Volleyball / Beach Volleyball in the world
- System of qualification of referees by AVC / FIVB
- Fundamental skills of a referee
- Rights and duties of an AVC Asian International referee and FIVB International referee

8.2 Theory of officiating

Current Official Volleyball Rules of the Game

- Administration of matches (FIVB / AVC Regulations for official competitions)
- Refereeing Guidelines and Instructions and Casebook for practical applications of the Official Volleyball / Beach Volleyball Rules of the Game
- Hand signals for officiating
- Psychological requirements of refereeing (for the function of VB / BVB referees)
- Scoring methods

8.3 Practice of officiating (1st, 2nd referee, scorer, assistant scorer and line judge)

- Confirmation and investigation of standard of judgment in play
- Practice of officiating (1st, 2nd referee, scorer, assistant scorer, line judges) for each participant.
- Management of special cases, critique of personal achievement during practice

9. EXAMINATIONS / Attestations and Certificates

9.1 Once the theoretical instruction has been completed, the participants must sit theoretical and practical examinations as follow

- Scoring test (with scoring practice)
- Written examination (official test)
- Practical examination during Volleyball / Beach Volleyball tournament (one complete minimum match requirements during the tournament)
- Oral examination (20 minutes for each participant)

9.2 Performances are evaluated per the following scale

Very Good - Good – Sufficient-Insufficient – Not competent

Form C-R6 reflects the performance including two main scores: Theoretical and Practical. The Practical score is divided into two portions: Refereeing (80%) and Scoring (20%). The Refereeing score is apportioned as follows: 1st Referee (55%), 2nd Referee (35%) and Line Judge (10%). Scoring is apportioned as follows: Scoring (80%) and Assistant Scoring (20%). Passing performance requires at least a performance of “Good” on one of the criteria (Theoretical and Practical) and at least “Sufficient” on the other criterion.

- Very Good = 85 and higher
- Good = 75 – 84.9
- Sufficient = 65-74.9
- Insufficient = 50-64.9
- Not competent = less than 50

9.3 When the examinations are over, the Course Director will give an Attestation to every participant showing the result of the examinations.

9.4 The AVC head quarter will send a Certificate to candidates having passed the examination and having been approved by the AVC Refereeing Committee at its annual meeting and endorsed at the annual AVC Board meeting.

With reference to your letter dated 11th June 2019, suspending Executive Committee of Volleyball Association of Maldives we note the note the followings:

1. That so far you have not specifically state any allegations against the Executive Committee or any specific member thereof,
2. That so far you have not provide reasonable time and opportunity to Executive Committee or any concerned member thereof, to defend itself/him/herself (should you have any specific allegations),
3. That the Executive Committee you suspended without justification, was duly elected in 2016 by the general assembly of Volleyball Association of Maldives as per Maldivian Volleyball Association Charter,
4. That your action is in clear violation of:
 - a. Maldivian Volleyball Association Charter,
 - b. Fédération Internationale de Volleyball Charter.
 - c. Asian Volleyball Confederation Charter.
 - d. International Olympic Committee Charter.

Having noted the above, we also acknowledge the government's contribution to the association and its efforts in promoting volleyball in the Maldives. We are, however, afraid that your arbitrary actions would have serious and long-term effect on this much-loved sport across the Maldives. It also undermines impartiality and independence of sports associations. Hence, we request avoiding open hostilities and resolve any issues through dialogue.

I also note that your notice of suspension of Executive Committee and handover of our office and office equipment was communicated to us after office hours on 11th June 2019 with a 10pm as handover deadline. And on the following day (12th June 2019) you have forcefully taken over the office and its equipment. All these actions took place while I am on an official trip to Bangkok to take part in the Asian Volleyball Confederation Board of Administration meeting. Just before my trip I met you in person and invited you for an open dialogue in resolving any issues of concern.

Once again, I invite you to cease all hostilities and resolve all outstanding issues, if any, through open dialogue.

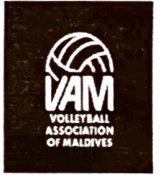

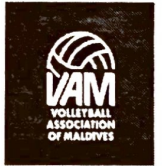
I am writing to inform you that the Commissioner of Sports of Maldives has sent a letter no. 141-COS/VAM/2019/30 dated 21st May 2019 informing that they would like to investigate some issue of the Volleyball Association of Maldives without highlighting any issue in the their letter.

Upon receiving the letter, the Executive Committee of the Volleyball Association of Maldives has decided to give necessary cooperation to the Sports Commissioner, and his investigation team.

After giving full support we sent a letter dated 6th June 2019 to find out the concerns submitted, however till date we have not been informed of the issues received by the Sports Commissioner and the findings of their investigation. I would also like to inform you that as of today no club member of Volleyball Association of Maldives have submitted any concern to our office and we are very closely working with our club members to complete the reform agenda commenced in February 2019. For your kind information 1st draft of the following protocols has been completed and already sent to our members and Commissioner Sports office for comments. Our intention is to achieve number one transparent administration within the National Sports Associations in Maldives.

1. Protocol on administration of commission
2. Procurement Protocol
3. Attendance and salary protocol
4. Bidding documents (in procuring good and services).
5. New constitutional amendments

Surprisingly we received the 2nd letter [no. 141-COS/VAM/2019/31] dated 11th June 2019 from Commissioner of Sports informing us that he has appointed a 5 member interim committee and to handover office of the Volleyball Association of Maldives, all the files, and other equipment at the Association to the interim committee without any reason and without hearing from us or giving us any opportunity to defend. We received the said letter after office hours at 4pm with deadline to hand over office at 10pm same day.

Furthermore, the Commissioner of Sports have forcefully taken over the office of Volleyball Association of Maldives at 11 am local time, while I was in Bangkok on official trip to attend Asian Volleyball Confederation Board of Administration meeting on 12th June 2019.

Mr. President, when I took over office on 1st October 2016, we had debts of more than USD 50,000.00 and we did not have any records in office even the hard disk of Secretary General's computer was missing. However, with great effort we managed to pay all debts as of today and we closed accounts for 2018 with a surplus. We also try our best to be a good partner for AVC and FIVB, during 2017, 2018 and 2019 by hosting the following events in Maldives.

1. 2018 FIVB World Women's Championship Qualification – AVC Central Zone
2. 2017 AVC Central Zone Men's Championship
3. 2018 AVC central zone annual meeting.
4. 2019 We will be hosting Beach Volleyball Continental Cup Phase 1 Central Zone in September 2019.

We are impressed with your leadership and with your close guidance we are trying our best to host more tournaments specially beach volleyball in next 2 years. Our past track record is testament of our ability to host such events.

Mr. President, we are elected by the general assembly of Volleyball Association of Maldives for 4 years in accordance with its Charter. Our term will end on 30th September 2020. It is sad to inform you that the Executive Committee of Volleyball Association of Maldives has been unconstitutionally dismissed by the Government of Maldives. Its action is politically motivated.

Hence, I would like to request your advice to proceed further. For your kind information I have enclosed copy and translation of the letters sent by Commissioner of Sports Maldives to us and our reply.

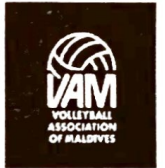
Mr. President, after the new government took office in November 2018, the government tried to dismiss the Executive Committee of Football Association of Maldives politically against constitution, however FIFA has intervened and sent a team to Maldives to find out the facts and saved the Executive Committee of Football Association of Maldives.
